- Reported he spoke with Gary Ward regarding the land acquisition contract.

Sheriff - Jacob Morrison

- Department decided not to purchase the original radios quoted and instead will purchase radios from John Atkin for approximately a \$10,000 reduction in cost.
- Payments for the new vehicles will total \$44,440.
- Estimated delivery time is 120 days.
- Kevin Stuber moved to allow the Sheriff to enter into a 5-year contract with ESU totaling \$277,254.00 for new equipment. Justin Clark 2nd, motion passed.

Extension Office - Krista Harding

- Kevin Stuber shared good news regarding contractor bids.
- Plans include a **metal roof**, new **A/C unit** on the north side of the building using existing ductwork, and a quick turnaround time.
- Will also talk to contractors about mortar work. Estimated project cost: \$32,336.00.
- Krista expressed appreciation and said they will remain out of the building until work is complete.
- Justin Clark asked for a project timeline; Kevin Stuber stated it should move quickly.
- Troy Birk requested Krista provide information on what Woodson County contributes compared to other counties.
- Justin Clark moved to accept the bid from ACE Refrigeration for the A/C work and from Shepard Farm for the roof installation with Kevin Stuber authorized to sign the contracts. Kevin Stuber 2nd, motion passed.

Solid Waste - David Waddell

- Presented the composting facility operation plan for Justin Clark's signature.
