Solid Waste - David Waddell

 - o Five-year plan approved.
 - Ongoing discussions on fee adjustments:
 - \$50 per property (Solid Waste).
 - \$192 residential refuse (higher for commercial).
- Stuber moved to approve Resolution 25-14 adopting the 5-year Solid Waste Plan. Clark seconded. Motion passed.

Road & Bridge - Gary Ward & Todd Green

- Collapsing culverts due to rust/wet conditions.
- · Bridge replacement grant not received.
- Emergency bridge replacement could cost ~\$250,000 (engineered bridge).
- Winter work hours to begin September 29: 7:30 a.m. 4:00 p.m.
- Old asphalt to be hauled to state park.

Treasurer - Michelle Zimmerman

- Presented July department reports.
 - Clark moved to accept July reports. Stuber seconded. Motion passed.

Rural Fire Budget Hearing

- Opened at 10:05 a.m.
- Chief Nick Barney:
 - Budget remains the same as last year.
 - 3% increase in personal services included, no additional tax dollars collected.
 - Trucks built in-house; may need to purchase pre-built in future.
 - o Truck fleet ranges from 2014 (newest) to 1965 (oldest).
 - o No borrowing since 2001. Over \$300,000 in special equipment fund.
- Recent Purchases:
 - o Jaws of Life: \$37,000.
 - Water Rescue Equipment (COVID funds).
- Clark moved to approve 2026 Rural Fire Budget. Stuber seconded. Motion passed.

County Revenue Neutral Rate Hearing

- Opened at 10:18 a.m.
- Citizens addressed concerns on spending and mill levy increases.
- Closed at 10:31 a.m.
- Roll Call Vote to Exceed RNR:
 - Clark Yea
 - Stuber Yea
 - Sedlacek Yea
- Clark moved to pass Resolution 25-15 Exceeding the RNR rate for the 2026 Budget. Stuber seconded. Motion passed.

2026 Woodson County Budget Hearing

- Opened at 10:36 a.m.
- Citizen asked about non-property tax revenue sources.
 - Treasurer Zimmerman: State distributions, sales tax, property tax. Investments earned ~\$250,000 in 2024.
- Ambulance Dept. struggles to meet revenue due to write-offs/unpaid bills.

- 2024 delinquent property taxes totaled \$286,000.
- County financial reserves: \$2.5 million in CDs, over \$5 million in checking.
- Proposed 2026 Budget:
 - Mill levy increase of 10 points (94.776 \rightarrow 104.256).
 - o Assessed valuation: \$51.1 million (up \$3 million).
- Employee Benefits mill levy up 5 points due to dwindling cash reserves.
- Closed at 11:32 a.m.
- Clark moved to approve 2026 Woodson County Budget. Sedlacek seconded. Motion passed.

Other Business

- · County Counselor Heim left at 11:36 a.m.
- Discussion on balancing revenue and expenditures while addressing infrastructure/service needs.
